## Wrapping Up 2014

It's hard to believe that we're wrapping up another year. 2014 has gone fast for me. As I write this final column of the year, I take a few moments to reflect on our year of flying and fellowship. Beginning in January, Alvin provided a concept that would serve as our

club's compass – be safe, be courteous and have fun. To a great extent, this occurred. From a safety perspective, we experienced a small number of incidents that can serve as teaching moments. Reminders that good judgment, common sense and a healthy respect for the equipment we're operating will go a long way to helping establish an incident free 2015. Whether this can be realized or not, it must be the goal we strive for.

As we begin 2015, we must remember to be focused and safe in the workshop as opportunity for injury surrounds us in the tools that we use and the chemicals that we work with. Our all-season flyers must practice good judgment and vigilance as the season that gives us snow-covered ground and a flight line light with activity can lend itself to a casual approach to disciplined flight safety practices. While many in the club take the winter off from flying, opportunities for accidents exist in all seasons. Adherence to our safety rules and good communication

between pilots will be the bedrock for an incident free winter. Also, build fires and use the propane heater with care.

For me, perhaps a seasonally warm day will offer enough encouragement to get some winter flying in. Beyond that, my idle time will be spent preparing a recently acquired 30cc TBF Avenger for flight. I've already amassed quite a list of things to do with this airframe as I must first address some suspect engineering, poor workmanship and obvious lapses in proper finishing before I can get to assembly. Ultimately, I procured something between an airplane that needed to be built and an ARF. With that said, I knew this going in so I view the work much more as a challenge than a headache. When complete, I hope to have an airplane that flies well and is a conversation piece. You see plenty of P-51s, P-47s and B-25s on R/C flight lines and at warbird events. You almost never see an Avenger. It'll be something unique.

In closing, I'd like to extend my thanks to Alvin for affording me the opportunity to continue as your Safety Chairman for 2015. I wish all of you a happy and safe holiday season.

Alvin Cole then closed Nominations for Officers and Directors at Large for the 2015 board.

**Jason Boettcher** announced that he would like to receive candidate statements and photos from any nominees who wish to submit one by this weekend. These candidate statements will be published in a special election edition of the Flypaper which will be published early next week.

**Paul Jacobs** announced that Dues (\$125.00) are due January 1<sup>st</sup>, and he will be collecting them at tonight's meeting for anyone who wants to pay them now. Paul also stated that the club typically picks up the cost of the pizza at the Rookies Christmas Pizza Party, so members can use money they would have spent on the dinner to increase their donations of gift cards for the Toys-for-Tots campaign.

**Show and Tell** – **Rich Gabrys** showed his Sean Tucker Challenger, which is actually a Wolfpitts Pro. Rich explained that this is a long project, and he appreciates being able to bring it in piece by piece to show the group his progress. Tonight he showed the group the fuselage and cowl. The fuselage is framed out of spruce and light plywood with a little bit of balsa in the rear, which was strategically placed to keep the weight towards the front. He just received the gear, which he had made by Graph Tech RC. Rich sent them the specifications and the weight of the airplane, and they made the gear. Rich hopes to finish the fuselage and start covering it sometime after Christmas.






**Dale Gathman** demonstrated a new Beatles 40 amp ESC made by Zone Top Way. He installed the ESC in his Parkzone T-28, along with a new E-Flite Power 10 motor. The ESC is available at Hobbytown for only \$20.00. The ESC does however behave differently than the E-Flite ESCs that he has used in the past. This new ESC zeroes itself wherever the throttle is positioned when it is energized. The concern is that if he energizes the ESC while the throttle cut switch is on, which actually sets the throttle at about negative 30%, that becomes the new zero point. As soon as the throttle cut is turned off, the motor starts running at a slow speed, even though the throttle is at zero. *The only way to prevent this is to make sure that the throttle is at zero and the throttle cut switch is off before powering up the ESC.* E-Flite ESCs do not auto zero when energized. Another different behavior that Dale found is that after running the motor for a bit, and then unplugging the battery, the capacitors in the ESC actually act like a generator and brake the motor until the capacitor charge dissipates. Dale brought these differences to the club's attention to



emphasize the importance of fully checking out new electronics and equipment with the plane in a safe position. All items need to be run through their full sequence of operation to determine whether everything runs the way the old equipment did, or is something behaving differently now. **Tom Siwek** reminded everyone that it is because of anomalies like this that we discourage pilots from plugging in batteries in the pavilion. Dale then displayed the LED lights on the T-28 for those members who have not seen them previously.



**Dale Gathman** next displayed photos that **Brian Wituk** took of **Dave Murray's** F-22, and Dale's Stinson. He also showed photos that he shot of **Jason Boettcher's** pattern plane which says 'TURKEY FLYIN' on the side, and **Mirlosaw Zakowany's** Blanik sailplane, modified for turbine power.

**Jason Boettcher** displayed a 'bare bones' Habu 2 kit from Horizon that he has been working on. He wanted to share with the members how difficult it has been to achieve 'more speed'. Jason had the stock plane and he liked it a lot, so he decided he wanted to make one that was faster. He has been working on it all summer, and so far has only had two successful flights with two different fans. He put the ESC in the fan intake to help it stay cool. He just got a 14 blade fan which he had balanced for him. The balancing took over two months. Jason said the high blade count fans sound good and they are fast. However keeping it running without 'throwing' a blade is a whole other issue Jason is trying to work through. Jason mentioned that he tried one of the Hobby King Doctor Mad Thrust setups fully assembled with an outrunner motor, and it sounds good but it is a dog. It was no faster than the stock setup. Jason now runs a 3200 6S LiPo in the plane.



Hearing no further business, President Alvin Cole asked for a motion to adjourn. Tom Spriet moved to adjourn, and John Fischer seconded. Motion passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 8:17 pm.



## Randolph Air Force Base

### Welcome to Randolph Air Force Base



Randolph AFB is named after Captain William Millican Randolph, a native of Austin, who was on the base naming committee at the time of his death in a crash.

It serves as headquarters of the Air Education and Training Command (AETC) as well as the Air Force Personnel Center (AFPC) and is known as "the Showplace of the Air Force" because of the Spanish Colonial Revival Style architecture in which all structures including hangars were constructed.

Captain Stephens, my daughter, got us a tour of the T38 training wing at Randolph AFB where she is stationed.



These pictures were taken Friday Oct 24, 2014 at Randolph AFB just outside of San Antonio, Texas. We also got to meet the T38 group training commander while there, nice guy.



They were training at the time of our visit, 2 in formation, taking off and landing next to the plane we got a close look at. We rode back to the flight office with 4 pilots that finished training in the T38's. Full flight suits with G-pants. They train the trainers at this base. Once trained, they go off to other bases to continue training other pilots.

We had a pilot show us the airplane and answer questions we asked him. We also had a guided tour of the offices, and operations ready room. They had many interesting pictures and awards on display. They take off and land at about 190mph. Each flight cost the taxpayers \$10,000; probably why I did not get a ride.

Very cool, very fast, very loud.

The T38 (Talon) is the name of the jets they use to train in:

The Northrop T-38 Talon is a two-seat, twin-engine supersonic jet trainer. It was the world's first supersonic trainer and is also the most produced. The T-38 remains in service as of 2014 in air forces throughout the world.

Northrop T-38 Talon started manufacturing in the mid 1960's.


