Fox Valley Aero Club Member Meeting Minutes January 12, 2023 at St. CharlesTownship Hall

 Welcome Members and Guests – Dale Gathman.
 Dale Gathman called the meeting to order at

Randy from Vend Pro presented three options for a replacement Pop Machine.

- 1) Dispenses 12oz cans only. \$750.
- 2) Dispenses bottles, Gatorade & cans \$1050 plus \$150 installation and removal.
- 3) Robotic arm machine (not recommended for outdoor use). FVAC will likely purchase option 2 around April 1 with the optional credit card reader \$250. The credit card reader will operate on cellular and require a monthly fee. The machine will hold:

10 Cases or 240 bottles or 500 cans or any pre-configured combination with possible 9 selections. The machine will accept \$1 and \$5 bills plus credit cards. The machine must be pre-configured and is not easily changed. Dale Gathman reported that the U of I contract has been renewed. The contract allows FVAC to use the property North of the

pavilion, and will auto renew unless either party requests cancellation at least 90 days before renewal date (January 1).

John Turner reminded members that the propane tanks used in the pavilion during the winter months can be refilled at Rental Max on Route 64. FVAC has an account. (Note: They will refill a maximum of 4 tanks if transported in your car).

John Turner showed his Hanger 9 RV-8. The 60" model was converted to electric from 4-Stroke glow.

The RV-8 will fly with a Castle 90 ESC, Extreme Flight motor and 6s 3300 battery.





Steve Gawlik showed his vintage Goldberg Shoestring along with the original construction article in the January 1966 Model Airplane News magazine. The Shoestring will fly with an OS 32. Steve plans to build a 108" version of the model in the future.

Mike Mueller from Gator RC showed the new PB2 modeled after the old Great planes Proud Bird. The 50" PB2 ARF is designed by Gator RC and manufactured to EF-1 racing specifications by Seagull models.





Dave Murray Showed his 2m Sebart Avanti Jet. The impressive model has a fiberglass fuselage, built-up wings and comes complete with fuselage stand and wing bags.

Dave Murray also showed an edge lit acrylic sign made for him by Mike Bargman. Mike will custom

engrave the signs and provide a remote control to change the light colors.

FVAC FROZEN FINGERS 2023

First-In-Flight Fun-Fly

Our annual First-In-Flight event, titled 'Frozen Fingers 2023' was held on Sunday, January 1st at 10:00 am at the field. The weather was pretty foggy, with the temperature a little bit above freezing. The wind was moderate out of the South-West. The runway and field were clear of snow, so conditions warranted a plane with wheels.

The goal of the event is to be the first pilot to have your airplane leave the ground once the starting signal is sounded. The pilot must then complete a minimum of one 'pattern' flight approximately the length of the runway (800'), and land successfully. The winner of the annual event gets his name plate added to our Frozen Fingers 'First in Flight' Champions plaque. The plaque is a perpetual plaque, and it contains the names of past winners along with the year of their victory.

In preparation for our annual tree/crashed airplane burning, I once again found a discarded Christmas Tree near my house a couple of days after Christmas. I delivered it to the field and put it in the stand on Friday. As pilots arrived on Sunday, two members brought remaining parts of their crashed airplanes to adorn the tree with. Gary Tice brought a giant scale J3 Cub — both wings and most of the fuselage. Tom Flint also brought a fuselage of his Piper Pawnee. We had a good turnout of members who showed up. A total of 8 pilots signed the log sheet to compete and we had around 25 additional members and a few spouses who came to watch the fun. We all got to wish each other a Happy New Year and catch up on things.

Because of the ideal wind direction, we were able to have the pilots line their planes up on the North edge of the runway, facing south-west. We had them start the line at the west most taxiway and line up west of that. This allowed for some great photos of the takeoff as the planes crossed the runway and worked to get into pattern.

Doug Swanson once again volunteered his photo shooting skills and shot the high-speed time-lapse photos of the start that we use to determine the winner. Paul Martin also volunteered to shoot a slow-motion video of the takeoff with his iPad. A lot of the members watching also filmed the action with their phones.

This year again, rather than count down the last ten seconds, I announced "Pilots Make Ready". I did not tell them how long it would be before I sounded the air horns. This new start method was initiated to prevent pilots from 'jumping the gun'. After about 7 seconds I blew the air horns. At the horn, all the pilots attempted to take off and fly their pattern. Amazingly, all eight pilots had successful flights and landings this year. Two of the first to take off (Scott and Jeff) were very close to colliding as seen in the photo but being the great pilots that they are were able to keep separation and have a successful flight. Once all pilots were back on the ground Doug, Paul and I went over the time lapse photos and iPad video to determine the winner. We could clearly see that Scott Stampfli was first in the air. Steve Haas was second in the air. Third place honors go to Jeff Mrachek who got off the ground shortly after Steve. Once the winner was determined, we announced it and presented Scott with the old First-in-Flight trophy (which is full and was replaced with the new plague) so that we could get a photo of the proud winner. One point of interest this year is that both First and Second place pilots were flying EFlite Turbo Timbers. Pilots may want to take note of that for next year. Also, another interesting fact is that the time between when the first plane left the ground and the third plane left the ground was less than one-half of a second.



These planes get off the ground fast and the pilots have awesome reflexes.

After the trophy was awarded, we lit the tree. This year Rob Sampson was there and again did the honor of lighting it up with a customary road flare. We had to add more charcoal lighter fluid as the tree was very green and was not lighting very quickly. Once we added the fluid, it finally started up and burned magnificently. It is always fun to watch the plane parts burn as the members say goodbye to their damaged planes.

As always, our January 1st First-in-Flight was another great FVAC first event of the year. It is such a blessing to have so many FVAC family come to the field on the first day of each year to spend a short time together and kick off the new year with each other. As in previous years, we started the year off right, doing what we love to do - fly and talk with our friends. If you were not able to make it this year, check out the photos to see what you missed. I hope that you will be able to attend next year so you can experience what this fun event is all about.

Cessna 195

As the weather has turned cold once again, I am continuing the Cessna 195 build. I wanted to share how I'm sheeting the top and bottom of the fuselage. As you can see in the picture the fuse top, bottom and sides are all flat with

radius corners.



My dilemma was how to sheet them. Here is the process I used.

These are some of the tools you will need for the work. You will need a long straight edge for trimming the edges of the sheeting. We all know that balsa sheets do not have straight edges, right? An Exacto Knife to cut with, masking tape, waterproof carpenters glue, 11 inch sanding block, sand bags and LOTS of clamps.



I have come up with a method to sand the edges once they are cut to a closer tolerance than the factory edge. The method I use to final sand the edges is to clamp a 33 inch sanding bar in a Black & Decker workmate. I can then sand the edges perfect. You can get a workmate off Facebook market place for about

\$20.




Next you will need to glue the edges to make larger sheets. I tape the edges together and fold them to apply glue. Now put them on a flat surface, tape side down. I use a razor blade to scrape of the squeeze out glue and wipe on a paper towel. When this is complete, use your sandbags to keep everything flat.






While the glue dries, I made a paper template of the top of the fuse. I went from the bottom of the top stringers. I cut it a little oversize. I then taped the template to the glued up sheeting and cut out my top fuse piece.



Next, I soaked the sheet with water several times and waited until it was flexible. This is why waterproof glue was used. I then clamped it to the top of the fuse and weighted it down for the night. Amazing what 24 hours can do.



The piece is ready to be trimmed to the center of the stringer. Remember we cut the template oversize? I used the same waterproof glue top to attach the sheeting. The same clamping was used as in the warping step above, just no water this time. I did the same methods for the bottom of fuse as well. I think it came out pretty good.



Filling in the sides should be a walk in the park, by comparison. I still have a lot more to put inside before that happens. I hope you enjoyed this.
