Show & Tell

Jeff Mrachek showed the scale Continental engine for his Clipped Wing Cub. This great looking engine is available from Top Notch Kits. It's built using Laser cut parts making it very lightweight.

Jeff also mentioned that Sig Manufacturing has relocated to Desplaines IL. It is possible to order on-line and pick up your items.



Armin Weber brought his Top Flite Giant Corsair. The 86" model has been fiber-glassed, detailed and is nearly ready for painting. Armin described the steps for creating panel lines, rivets, and rib stitching.

Steve Gawlik showed a very cool helicopter model from Ugears Mechanical Models. The laser cut kit is made up of 438 pieces with a 118-page instruction manual. All parts fit together without glue and require about 18 hours to complete.



Dave Baker brought his next project, a Gloster Gladiator from Dura-fly. The 43" biplane includes motor, ESC and servos. Dave was looking for some guidance with the assembly. Several of the members offered suggestions, and help.

FVAC Frozen Fingers 2024 First in Flight Fun Fly by Dale Gathman

Our annual First-In-Flight event, titled 'Frozen Fingers 2024' was held on Monday, January 1st at 10:00 am at the field. The weather was overcast, with the temperature hovering around freezing. The wind was moderate out of the North-West. The runway and field were clear of snow, so conditions warranted a plane with wheels.

The goal of the event is to be the first pilot to have your airplane leave the ground once the starting signal is sounded. The pilot must then complete a minimum of one 'pattern' flight approximately the length of the runway (800'), and land successfully. The winner of the annual event gets his name plate added to our Frozen Fingers 'First in Flight' Champions plaque. The plaque is a perpetual plaque, and it contains the names of past winners along with the year of their victory.

In preparation for our annual tree/crashed airplane burning, I scoured my neighborhood on Saturday evening, hoping to find the elusive discarded tree. I covered much of the west side of Elgin with no luck. I finally spotted a discarded tree about two blocks from my house, and I threw it on my car and took it home. On Sunday I tied the tree to the top of my car and brought it out to the field to mount in our tree burning stand. This year was much calmer as far as wind, and I was able to put the tree in the shed to await the event the next day. On Monday, the members arrived, some with planes to compete with, some with broken plane parts to put on the tree, and many just to enjoy each other's company and watch the action. We had a good turnout of members who showed up. A total of 13 pilots signed the log sheet to compete and we had many additional members and a few spouses who came to watch the fun. We all got to wish each other a Happy New Year and catch up on things.

Because of the wind coming out of the North-West, the pilots lined their planes up across the runway facing west.

This year, Doug was under the weather, so I shot the high-speed time-lapse photos of the start that we use to determine the winner. Tracy Wienrich also volunteered to shoot a video of the takeoff. John Turner manned the airhorns.

I announced "Pilots Make Ready". I did not tell them how long it would be before JT sounded the air horns. This new start method was initiated to prevent pilots from 'jumping the gun'. After a few seconds JT blew the air horns. At the horn, all the pilots attempted to take off and fly their pattern. This year, we had one plane wing over and crash, and one plane using wheels on a dolly had the wheels not leave the ground. Another was not able to take off. The remaining ten planes had a successful flight and landing.

Following the action, Tracy and I went over the time lapse photos and video to determine the winner. This was the closest result we have ever had. My camera shoots eight frames per second, and from one frame to the next (0.125 second), three planes were off the ground. Luckily, between the photos and the video, we were able to determine the winner by a very small margin.

Our Master Tree Lighter, Rob Sampson, did the honor of lighting it up with a customary road flare. Once the flame caught, the tree went up very quickly. It is always fun to watch the plane parts burn as the members say goodbye to their damaged planes.

As always, our January 1st First-in-Flight was another great FVAC first event of the year. It is such a blessing to have so many FVAC family come to the field on the first day of each year to spend a short time together and kick off the new year with each other. As in previous years, we started the year off right, doing what we love to do - fly and fellowship with our friends. If you were not able to make it this year, check out the photos to see what you missed. I hope that you will be able to attend next year so you can experience what this fun event is all about.

Pilot Figure Painting Techniques by Armin Weber

Here is a brief review of the steps used on the pilot figure for my TopFlite F4U Corsair.

The pilot figure is from Lyle Vasser of Best Pilots. His pilots are 1/5 Scale and historically accurate. His scale reproductions are of actual WW II pilots including Bob Sweeney and Pappy Boyington. It takes about 1 day to paint a figure.

1. Use small file to clean any burrs.

2. Using the airbrush I sprayed the figure with Vellego acrylic beige and a flesh tone on the face.

3. Use pastel chalk to add color and details to the face.. Use a Dremel sanding drum to grind some chalk to a fine powder. Apply the powder with a small makeup brush. Some red on the cheeks and between the lips. Brown under the nose, eyes and mouth to create shadows Highlight other areas with white. 4. Paint the rest of the pilot with acrylic craft paints.

5. Dry brush with light or dark colors to breakup the high and low areas on the flight suit.

6. Spray a coat of flat clear like Testors Dullcote to even out the colors.

Gregory "Pappy" Boyington (December 4, 1912 – January 11, 1988) was an American combat pilot who was a United States Marine Corps fighter ace during World War II. He received the Medal of Honor and the Navy Cross. A Marine aviator with the Pacific fleet in 1941, Boyington joined the "Flying Tigers" (1st American Volunteer Group) of the Republic of China Air Force and saw combat in Burma in late 1941 and 1942 during the military conflict between China and Japan.

In September 1942, Boyington rejoined the Marine Corps. In early 1943, he deployed to the South Pacific and began flying combat missions in the F4U Corsair fighter. On August 14, 1943, he took command of Marine fighter squadron VMF-214 ("Black Sheep").

In January 1944, Boyington, outnumbered by Japanese "Zero" planes, was shot down into the Pacific Ocean after downing one of the enemy planes. He was captured by a Japanese submarine crew and was held as a prisoner of war for more than a year and a half. He was released shortly after the surrender of Japan.
