# **Anzani Longster Repairs**

FVAC members may remember Victor Miller flying his amazing scratch-built planes. I was fortunate enough to inherit his 40% Anzani Longster, also known to club members as "Snoopy's Flying Circus".



This photo is from Joe Nall, a month before Air Supremacy over Goshen 2024.

I was flying Snoopy at Air Supremacy over Goshen 2024 and clipped the top of the barbed wire fence while attempting a dead stick landing (I forgot to fuel up before flying). Victor Miller volunteered to make repairs to the Anzani Longster and I wanted to share the photos and process that Victor followed to make the repairs.


Victor started by cutting away the damaged structure and replacing it with Lite-Ply. He then "scabbed" over the edge glued ply on both sides to restore strength to the fuselage side structure and firewall. It is a good thing that I did not attempt the repairs myself. I had to ask Victor what "Scabbed" meant. It refers to gluing a piece of wood over the top of the repair so that the edge glued "plug" is merely the "meat inside the sandwich". Edge gluing alone adds little strength.







Base color applied. This is a butted joint to avoid a pronounced bulge under the final red covering. It is curved only to exude skill and workmanship.









Landing gear rebuild. Alignment and soldering.





The bends on the gear are precisely aligned and tack soldered. The next step is to wind the joints with copper wire and do the final soldering. Unfortunately, alignment of the gear with the wings installed to check for a level stance was difficult because the tack solder would not support the weight of the plane. Weight was not an issue during the initial construction because the bones of the plane weighed under 10 pounds.





After the gear structure was complete, the tedious work of doing the scale detail started. Wood was built up around the piano wire and the damaged aluminum struts were rebuilt.

Shock absorber, and fairing on landing gear were finished and Victor finished up the repairs with some nice custom details that you will need to wait to see at the field or the next event.









I am planning on returning to Joe Nall and Goshen this year. Snoopy's Flying Circus will be at Windy City Warbirds and Classics for sure this year!



# Byron Beechcraft Staggerwing Submitted by Armin Weber

All construction is complete, and the foam parts have been fiberglassed. Next was three rounds of priming, filling and sanding. I used a white primer because the base color will be white.

The Byron retracts were assembled and installed. After a lot of tedious work they function well.

A few more hours of prep and it's ready for paint.

# THE SPOOR

It was Fall and the Field weekday crew was busy discussing the intricacies of flight when the subject of winter projects arose. A quick internet search produced a long list of aircraft from a bygone era. Of particular interest to me was a gull wing 30's vintage free flight aircraft referred to as the Spook.



Only one supplier of a Spook was identified, Hanger One located in New Zealand. Hanger One provides a short and full kit. I had two apprehensions, ordering something from New Zealand from an unknown supplier and the shipping costs/shipping time. Ultimately a full Spook kit was entered into the shopping cart. In round numbers the kit was \$300 and shipping \$50. Given that a US stamp is now \$0.70+, \$50 bucks didn't seem outrageous. Hoping that shipping wouldn't require a slow-mo cargo ship, eight days after placing the order, the Spook showed up at my doorstep courtesy of DHL airfreight into O'Hare after an 8,000+ mile journey.

The kit was in excellent condition. Little or no instructions were provided but full sized plans from a bygone era were included along with a modern drawing showing the dual balsa laminated spars. After a few tries the spars were assembled along with six different rib sizes Throughout the process the aft spar was shimmed to accommodate the under cambered ribs.

The fuselage was fairly straight forward with the exception of the windscreen. After several (maybe more than several) attempts, an acceptable windscreen was constructed of 0.20 Lexan.

The landing gear needed to be formed from metal spars salvaged from a deceased Balsa USA Fokker D8 (kinda like an organ transplant). Wheels and tires were selected for their light weight, approximately 1.5 ounces each. When the wing was completed, it lacked torsional rigidity. Additional bracing was added between the fore and aft spars for the majority of bays. Butt joints in the fuse were reinforced with gussets.

The 72 inch wingspan Spook is powered by a Saito 40. Covering is transparent orange Coverite. Weighing in at a little less than 5 pounds including approximately 6 ounces of nose weight (whoopsie). A calm day will be required

for the first flight!
